Sir,

At the time that I entered into communication with Haider Pacha respecting the walling in of the British Burial Ground here, I took occasion to call His Excellency's attention to the Building which Antonio Eyoub was erecting here, under the Auspices of the French Consul. The following day the works were suspended, - whether by Haider Pacha or not, I cannot discover. - But I have the honor to apprise Your Excellency that to day, they have been resumed, and not as heretofore, under pretence of its being for a private Dwelling, or a Soap Manufactory, as it was previously given out, but it is openly avowed to be for
