I have the honor to apprise
 Your Lordship that on the 2^d Instant
 Her Majesty's Steamer "Volcano" from
 Athens, landed at Caiffa the Prince
 and Princess Chlodwig Hohenzollern
 Schillingsfürst, who rested that night
 at the monastery of Mount Carmel
 and proceeded next morning towards
 Jerusalem, where their Serene
 Highnesses arrived on Tuesday the 9th
 and took lodgings in the Hospice called
 Casa nuova attached to the Latin Convent.
 Having shown them all the attention

of which I was capable, their Serene
Highnesses left Jerusalem on the 12th,
and I accompanied them to Jaffa,
where they expected the "Volcano" to arrive
from Caiffa for their reception.

The steamer not having arrived,
they proceeded to Caiffa themselves, and
embarked on Thursday the 18th - but
the weather being heavy, they broke the
chain cable, and the anchor remained
in the Bay - which was however
recovered the next day, and their
Highnesses sailed away.
